But there may be someone reading this column today, perhaps you, that just stumbled across this for one reason or another (I am sure it is not because of my good-looking picture, so I just will chalk it up to the Holy Spirit). But for whatever reason you are here (and whether you care or not) I pray that you will care about what I am going to write next:

YOU ARE A SINNER.

Do I have your attention? No? Well, let me try again.

DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOU WILL SPEND ETERNITY AFTER YOU DIE?

How about now because that is a serious question to consider? You see, the fact of the matter is that you WILL die some today AND either you will be taken up to heaven to be with God or you will suffer in eternal torment in hell. There is no middle ground and there is no avoiding these two options. You are not saved because you are a good person. You are not saved because you are not as bad as your neighbor.
